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Authority to Inspect

The Tusla Early Years Inspectorate carries out inspections of Early Years Services under Section 58(D) of the Child Care Act 1991 (as inserted by Section 92 of the Child and Family Agency Act 2013).

Description of Service	<p>Naíonra Leim an Bhradaín was established in 2011 as a privately run childcare service for pre-school children aged 2 years to 6 years by the present Registered Provider.</p> <p>The service provides sessional childcare and education to children from 08:40 to 11:40am and 12:00 – 15:00hrs.</p> <p>Learning is facilitated through an emergent interest curriculum delivered through the medium of the Irish language in the service.</p> <p>There is a large secure outdoor area available to the children for daily outdoor play.</p> <p>The proposed change as advised by the registered provider is increase the numbers of children attending from 17 – 19.</p>
Premises	<p>The service is situated in a classroom at the rear of the national school situated on the outskirts of an urban area and the service has its own entrance door.</p>
Staffing	<p>Naíonra Leim an Bhradaín employs four childcare staff including the Registered Provider. The Registered Provider works directly with the preschool children. The adults working in the service have completed a major award in Early Childhood Care and Education at Levels 5, 6 and 7 as per the National Framework of Qualifications.</p>
Methodology	<p>The inspection was an announced inspection to assess compliance with the Childcare Act 1991 (Early Years Services) Regulations 2016 and Childcare Act 1991 (Early Years Services) (Amendment) Regulations 2016. The Inspection focused on regulations under the following themes: Governance, Health, Welfare and Development of the child, Safety and Premises.</p> <p>The findings on inspection based on information obtained through examination of documentation, direct observation, and discussion with relevant staff are documented in the inspection report and taken into consideration when making a decision in relation to registering the change in circumstance. Regulation 9 – Management and Recruitment

(1) A registered provider shall ensure that—

(a) the service has a designated person in charge and a named person who is able to deputise as required.

Requirement met:

The requirement has been met.

(1) (a) The registered provider is the designated person in charge and a named person to deputise as required.

Part III - Management and Staff

Regulation 11 -Staffing Levels

(1) Subject to this Regulation, a registered provider shall ensure that there is at all times an adequate number of adults working directly with the children attending the pre-school service.

Requirement met:

The requirement is met.

(1) The registered provider has ensured that there is at all times an adequate number of adults working directly with the children attending the pre-school service.

Part V - Care of Child in Pre-school Service

Regulation 20 - Facilities for Rest and Play

- (1) *Subject to this Regulation, a registered provider shall ensure that—*
- (a) *having regard to the number of pre-school children attending the service, their respective ages and the amount of time they spend on the premises, there are adequate and suitable facilities for each child to play indoors and, where required by these Regulations, outdoors, during the day, and*
 - (b) *there are adequate and suitable facilities for a pre-school child to rest during the day, and in the case of an overnight pre-school service, during the day and the night.*
- (3) *A registered provider of a full day care service, a part-time day care service or a childminding service, other than such a service to which paragraph (2) applies, shall ensure that –*
- (a) *A suitable, safe and secure outdoor space to which the pre-school children attending the service have access to on a daily basis is provided on the premises.*

Requirement met:

The requirement is met.

(1)

(a) The pre-school room has suitable play materials and equipment for children aged from 2 years and 8 months to attend an Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) sessional service. The physical and material environment has been developed with dedicated play areas that included a home/kitchen area, construction area and library area, small world materials, a sand tray, puzzles, jigsaws, art materials and equipment for fine and gross motor activity skills were displayed on low level shelving. A sufficient and appropriate number of child-size tables and chairs to cater for the proposed number of children were available.

(b) The rest area was comfortable. It consisted of a child sized sofa placed in a quiet area in the room. It was available for any child wishing to take a break from activities and rest.

(3)(a) The outside play area was safe, suitable and secure. It was enclosed by a boundary fence and secured entrance gates. The service can access the school hall for use during inclement weather.

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Part V - Care of Child in Pre-school Service

Regulation 22 – Food and Drink

A registered provider shall ensure that adequate and suitable, nutritious and varied food and drink is available for each pre-school child attending the pre-school service.

Requirement met:	<p>The requirement is met.</p> <p>The service has a healthy eating policy in place.</p> <p>Parents are requested to provide a healthy snack for their child in line with the healthy eating policy of the service. Water is freely available to the children at all times. There is a fridge available for the storage to children’s snacks.</p>
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Part VI – Safety

Regulation 23 - Safeguarding health, safety and welfare of child

A registered provider shall ensure that all reasonable measures are taken to safeguard the health, safety and welfare of a pre-school child attending the service and that the environment of the service is safe.

Requirement met:	<p>The requirement is met.</p> <p>Access to the pre-school room is through the main entrance or an entrance at the rear of the school side which is electronically secured and is controlled by staff members. The door to the premises is secured to prevent children from exiting unsupervised.</p> <p>Cleaning agents are safely stored out of the reach of children.</p> <p>There was storage space in the pre-school room to store the children’s personal belongings safely.</p> <p>Thermostatically controlled hot water, liquid hand soap, paper hand towels are available in the two sanitary areas for hygienic hand washing and drying and foot pedal operated bins for hygienic and safe disposal of used paper towel and tissues are available.</p> <p>The fire exits were clearly marked and unobstructed.</p>
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Part VI - Safety

Regulation 25 – First Aid

- (1) A registered provider shall ensure that a person trained in first aid for children is, at all times, immediately available to the children attending the pre-school service.
- (2) A registered provider shall ensure that a suitably equipped first aid box for children—
- (a) is safely stored in an easily accessible and conspicuous position on the premises, and
 - (b) is available to the children attending the pre-school service at all times.

Requirement met:

The requirement is met.

(1) Current certification in relation to persons qualified in First Aid Response (FAR) was available for two staff members that will be working in the service.

(2)(a)(b) A suitably equipped first aid box is available and accessible to children. It was observed to be stored in a conspicuous position in the pre-school room.

Part VI – Safety

Regulation 26 – Fire Safety Measures

- (1) A registered provider shall ensure that a record in writing is kept of—
- (a) any fire drill that takes place in the premises, and
 - (b) the number, type and maintenance record of firefighting equipment and smoke alarms in the premises.
- (4) A notice of the procedures to be followed in the event of fire shall be displayed in a conspicuous position in the premises.

Requirement met:

The requirement is met.

(1)

(a) Documentation was available for recording monthly fire drills. The most recent fire drill was conducted on 19 March 2024.

(b) There were maintenance records available of the number, type and maintenance of firefighting equipment and the smoke alarm, which were 5 October 2023 and 20 April 2023, respectively.

(4) A notice of the procedures to be followed in the event of fire was clearly displayed on the premises.

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Part VI – Safety

Regulation 28 – Insurance

A registered provider shall ensure that the pre-school service is adequately insured.

Requirement met:

The requirement is met.

An insurance certificate was submitted to the Registration Team prior to this inspection.

The registered provider must ensure that adequate insurance is in place prior to the commencement of the change. The change approval is contingent on the registered providers compliance with Regulation 28.

The registered provider had evidence of insurance cover for 22 children. The insurance cover was valid from 28 November 2023 – 27 March 2024.

Part VII – Premises and Space Requirements

Regulation 29 – Premises

A registered provider shall ensure that the premises of the service are—

- (a) of sound and stable structure,*
- (b) safe and secure,*
- (c) kept adequately lit, heated and ventilated,*
- (d) cleaned, maintained and repaired, as required, and*
- (e) equipped with adequate and suitable sanitary facilities.*

Requirement met:

The requirement is met.

(a) Visually, the proposed pre-school room and premises were in a state of good repair.

(b) The pre-school room was located in the premises and was secured from unauthorised entry by an electronically secured main door which is controlled by staff members.

(c) There were two openable windows in the proposed pre-school room providing natural daylight and ventilation. Two strip lights and two circular lights with protective coverings to provide additional artificial lighting were fitted also.

The sanitary areas were ventilated by openable windows which were all observed to be open.

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	<p>The pre-school room was heated by wall mounted radiators that were thermostatically controlled.</p> <p>(d) Daily cleaning schedules were in place for the pre-school room and sanitary areas.</p> <p>(e) A total of two toilets and two wash hand basins are provided for children’s use in the sanitary areas attached to the pre-school room.</p> <p>This is adequate to cover the requirements of the total number of children attending the service including the proposed pre-school room.</p> <p>There is one toilet and one wash hand basin facility available for staff members to use in the service.</p>
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Part VII – Premises and Space Requirements

Regulation 30 – Minimum Space Requirements

- (1) Subject to paragraphs (2) to (6), a registered provider shall ensure that adequate clear floor space is available in the premises for the work, play and movement of children attending the pre-school service.*
- (3) A registered provider of a sessional pre-school service or a pre-school service in a drop-in centre shall ensure that a minimum of 1.818 square metres of clear floor space is available for each child attending the service.*

Requirement met:	<p>The requirement has been met.</p> <p>(1) (3)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A total clear floor space of 34.8m² is available in the proposed pre-school room for the maximum daily attendance of 19 children aged 2 years 8 months – 6 years on a sessional basis attending ECCE care provision.
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
