Authority to Inspect

The Tusla Early Years Inspectorate carries out inspections of Early Years Services under Section 58(J) of the Child Care Act 1991 (as inserted by Section 92 of the Child and Family Agency Act 2013).

Description of service

This full day care service is located in the village of Cloonfad in County Roscommon. The service is registered to provide childcare service for children aged from 1 -6 years of age between the hours of 07:30-18:00 hrs. A registered school age service is also provided. The premises is a two-storey purpose-built building with the ground floor dedicated to the provision of childcare and a private dwelling on the first floor. There are four playrooms for use by the preschool children, a dedicated sleep room, office, kitchen, staff room and sanitary accommodation provided. An enclosed outdoor play area is provided to the side of the building.

Staffing

There are nine staff working in the service which included the person in charge, childcare staff and a cook. Two students were also in attendance on work placements.

Methodology

Tusla's Early Years Inspectorate is the independent statutory regulator of early years services in Ireland. The Child Care Act 1991 (Early Years Services) Regulations 2016 define the duty of a registered provider to ensure the safety and well-being of children and to comply with these regulations. This Act also gives Tusla the authority to assess compliance with the regulations. The purpose of regulation in relation to early years services is to ensure that the care, safety, and well-being of children attending such services is upheld. Inspections of early years services are planned based on the following:

- Previous inspection history
- Any information received in relation to the service

The findings on inspection are based on:

- Information obtained through examination of documentation
- Direct observation
- Discussion with relevant staff

This inspection was unannounced and focused on the regulations 9,11,22,23,25,26 and 28. The inspection may also focus on other areas as required.

Inspection findings are documented in the inspection report which is first issued in draft format to the service with an opportunity to respond to any findings. Where statutory requirements are identified as not being met, the registered provider must demonstrate how they have rectified the non-compliance and will prevent any non-compliance from re occurring. The Corrective Action and Preventive Action plan (CAPA) will be used to inform decisions about compliance with regulatory requirements. Where the registered provider fails to meet the statutory requirements an escalation process may be commenced.

Part III – Management and Staff

Regulation 9 – Management and recruitment

(1) A registered provider shall ensure that-

- (a) the service has a designated person in charge and a named person who is able to deputise as required,*
- (b) at all times during the period when the pre-school service is being carried on, the designated person in charge or the named person referred to in subparagraph (a) is on the premises,*

(2) A registered provider shall ensure that each employee, unpaid worker and contractor is suitable and competent taking into consideration the nature of the needs of children, including by-

- (a) consideration of references from the person's past employers, if any, and in particular the most recent employer, if any,*
- (b) consideration of references from reputable sources in the case of a person who has no past employers,*
- (c) consideration of the vetting disclosure received from the National Vetting Bureau of the Garda Síochána in accordance with the Act of 2012 in respect of the person, and*
- (d) ensuring, insofar as is practicable, that where a person has lived in a state other than the State for a period of longer than 6 consecutive months, he or she provides police vetting from the police authorities in that state.*

(4) A registered provider shall ensure that, without prejudice to the generality of paragraph (2) and subject to paragraphs (5) and (6), each employee working directly with children attending the service holds at least a major award in Early childhood Care and Education at Level 5 on the National Qualifications Framework or a qualification deemed by the Minister to be equivalent.

Compliance Information

- (1)(a) There was a named person in charge and a named person to deputise as required.
- (b) A sample of staff rosters reviewed found that the person in charge or deputy person in charge were available at all times.
- (2) Through discussion with the designated person in charge, it was advised that no new staff were employed since the most recent focused inspection of the 7th of November 2025.
- Two students have commenced in the service on work placements
- (a) &(b) Four of the four written validated references, on file for the students on work placement were from a past employer or from a source other than the past employer.
- (c) Garda vetting disclosures had been obtained for nine staff members and the two students on work placement. The service demonstrated compliance with the Early Years Inspectorate Regulatory Notice requiring services to renew Garda vetting every three years.
- (d) Two of the staff had worked outside the jurisdiction, for six months or more, while over the age of 18 years of age and had the required police vetting on file.
- (4) The nine staff who were working directly with children, held a Quality and Qualifications Ireland (QQI), at a Level 5 to 7 in Early Childhood Care and Education. Copies of qualifications were on file for the nine staff.

Part III – Management and Staff

Regulation 11 - Staffing levels

- (1) Subject to this Regulation, a registered provider shall ensure that there is at all times an adequate number of adults working directly with the children attending the pre-school service.*
- (2) Subject to paragraphs (4) and (5), a registered provider of a full day care service or a part-time day care service shall ensure that at all times the minimum ratio of adults to children specified in column (3) of Part 1 of Schedule 6 opposite a particular reference number specified in column (1) of that Part in respect of the age range of the children specified in column (2) thereof at that reference number is satisfied.*
- (4) Subject to paragraph (5), where a registered provider contemporaneously provides-*
- (a) a sessional pre-school service, and*
 - (b) a full day care service or a part-time day care service, or both, the minimum ratio of adults to children applicable for the duration of the sessional pre-school service in respect of the children attending that service shall be the ratio specified in paragraph (3).*

Compliance Information

- (1) On the morning of the unannounced inspection there were seven staff working directly with the forty-nine children in attendance in the service. A relief staff member also provided relief cover for breaks.
- (2) The following adult to child ratios were provided during the unannounced inspection in line with the required ratios taking into consideration the ages of the children and the length of time each child spent in the service as follows:
- In the baby room: 2 adults cared for seven children aged from 1 to 2 years of age in the morning and 2 adults cared for seven children aged 1 to 2 years in the afternoon,
- In the toddler room two adults cared for twelve children aged from 2 years to 3 years in the morning and two adults cared for twelve children aged from 2 years to 3 years in the afternoon.
- In the junior playschool room: 2 adults cared thirteen children aged from 3 to 4 years of age in the morning and 2 adults cared for nine children aged from 3 to 4 years in the afternoon.
- In the senior Montessori room: 2 adults cared for seventeen children aged from 4 to 5 years of age in the morning and 2 adults cared for nine children aged from 4 to 5 years in the afternoon A relief person was also available to cover breaks and staff lunches.
- (8)(a) There were at least 2 adults present at all times during the unannounced inspection.

Part V - Care of Child in Pre-school Service

Regulation 22 – Food and drink

A registered provider shall ensure that adequate and suitable, nutritious and varied food and drink is available for each pre-school child attending the pre-school service.

Compliance Information

- There was a healthy eating policy in the service. The person in charge advised that healthy eating was promoted within the service by visual aids, and adherence to best practice guidelines.
- The service had a designated kitchen staff who prepares and cooked the meals and snacks. All meals and snacks were provided by the service, for children attending on a full day care / part time basis.
- From 07:30hrs to 9:00hrs children were provided with breakfast to consist of a selection of cereals, toast with milk or water to drink
- At 10:00hrs the children had their morning snack of fruits to include bananas, apples. oranges and grapes with water to drink.
- At 12.00hrs, the main meal of spaghetti bolognese was offered to the children.
- An afternoon snack of crackers and water was provided for the children.

- At 16:00hrs the children are offered sandwiches with ham and cheese and water to drink.
- At each meal and snack the children had the opportunity for second portions and/or an alternative.
- Cutlery, plates, and crockery were offered for children's meal/snack times.
- Drinking water was available and accessible to children in each playroom.

Part VI - Safety

Regulation 23 - Safeguarding health, safety and welfare of child

A registered provider shall ensure that all reasonable measures are taken to safeguard the health, safety and welfare of a pre-school child attending the service and that the environment of the service is safe.

Compliance Information

General Safety:

- The main entrance door to the service and the external play areas to the side of the premises were secure so that children could not leave the area unsupervised and unauthorised persons could not enter.
- The inspector was admitted by staff following production of identification documents.
- Cleaning products were stored out of reach of children.
- The kitchen was inaccessible to the children.
- Toys and play equipment were in good condition and suitable for the age and developmental stages of the children using them on the day.
- Fire doors throughout the building were unobstructed.
- Leads, cables, and flexes were wall mounted and secured to prevent any trip or strangulation hazard. The heating system was thermostatically controlled, to ensure the temperature was maintained between 18°C to 22°C.

Infection Control:

- The service was found to be very clean, and staff were observed to clean down surfaces such as tables and highchairs after use.
- Staff kept written records of cleaning procedures carried out in the service.
- Warm water, liquid soap and paper towels were provided for handwashing and drying purposes with children and staff cleaning their hands regularly.
- Aprons and gloves were used appropriately by staff when changing children's nappies with changing mats

cleaned down after use.

- Appropriate bins were used for the disposal of nappies.
- There were separate storage boxes of children's personal items such as nappies and cleansing wipes and change of clothes.
- Individual storage containers were provided for children's soothers. Boxes of tissues were available in the playrooms.
- Windows were opened by staff at times to ventilate the playrooms.

Administration of Medication:

- The staff showed awareness of the correct procedures for the administration and storage of medication.
- No child was required to have medication given to them during the inspection.

Safe Sleep:

- Standard wooden cots were provided in a separate sleep room and used by the young children in the service.
- The cot mattresses had wipeable coverings and were cleaned appropriately with individual bed linen provided.
- The air temperature of the sleep room where a child was sleeping was recorded at 16.9°C within the required range of 16-20 °C for a child of this age.
- Adequate space was available in the sleep room to allow 50cm of space between each cot.
- The staff were observed to preform regular checks on a sleeping child at least every ten minutes recording observations of their colour, breathing and position.
- Staff demonstrated an awareness of sudden infant death prevention guidance placing children down to sleep on their backs and monitoring sleep room temperatures regularly.

Fire Safety:

- The emergency exits were observed to be unobstructed during the inspection.

Outing:

- It was advised by the person in charge that the older children went on an outing to a pet farm.
- The service had insurance for outings.
- The person in charge ensured that parents had provided consent, a risk assessment was carried out prior to the outing, emergency numbers are brought and there was a staff member with first aid / a first aid

box on the outing, in the event of an emergency.

Non-Compliance Information

Infection Control:

- The large sand play area was not covered in the outdoor area which could pose a risk of animal excrement and infection to a preschool child. The sand play area must be covered when not in use to prevent this risk.

Action submitted by the Registered Provider

Corrective & Preventive Action

Infection Control:

The person in charge submitted a written response to state that covers have been made to cover the sand play area and these will be used when the sand is not in use and all exposed areas will be covered if necessary.

Supporting documentation submitted

Infection Control:

The person in charge submitted photographic evidence to advise of the covers fitted on the sand play area.

Summary Comment

The office of the early years inspectorate has assessed the action taken and evidence submitted and deems it to meet the non-compliance noted under regulation 23.

Part VI - Safety

Regulation 25 - First aid

(1) A registered provider shall ensure that a person trained in first aid for children is, at all times, immediately available to the children attending the pre-school service.

(2) A registered provider shall ensure that a suitably equipped first aid box for children-

(a) is safely stored in an easily accessible and conspicuous position on the premises, and

(b) is available to the children attending the pre-school service at all times.

Compliance Information

(1) All staff had completed a first aid responder qualification in November 2024 thereby ensuring a person trained was immediately available.

(2)(a) The first aid boxes were stored on a high shelf in each of the playrooms in an easily accessible conspicuous position for the staff and inaccessible to the children.

(b) The first aid boxes had content items within date.

Part VI - Safety

Regulation 26 - Fire safety measures

- (1) A registered provider shall ensure that a record in writing is kept of-
- (a) any fire drill that takes place in the premises, and
 - (b) the number, type and maintenance record of fire fighting equipment and smoke alarms in the premises.
- (4) A notice of the procedures to be followed in the event of fire shall be displayed in a conspicuous position in the premises.

Compliance Information

- (1)(a) Arrangements were in place to record monthly fire drills. The last documented fire drill was dated 19th of March 2026.
- (b) A record of the number, type, and maintenance of firefighting equipment in the service was on file. Records indicated that the last annual maintenance for the firefighting equipment was dated 17th of September 2025. Records indicated that the last maintenance for the fire detection system was dated 17th of February 2026.
- (4) A notice of the procedures to be followed in the event of a fire was displayed in each room.

Part VI - Safety

Regulation 28 - Insurance

A registered provider shall ensure that the pre-school service is adequately insured.

Compliance Information

There was evidence of certification of adequate insurance which had an expiry date 27th of March 2027.

The insurance for 66 children was for full day care service, included the following: -

- public liability insurance,
- insurance against fire and theft,
- buildings insurance,
- insurance for outings undertaken as part of the service provision.
