Authority to Inspect

The Tusla Early Years Inspectorate carries out inspections of Early Years Services under Section 58(D) of the Child Care Act 1991 (as inserted by Section 92 of the Child and Family Agency Act 2013).

Description of Service	This part time service was established to provide care and education to children aged between 2 and 6 years old. A registered school age care service is also provided. The service operates from 08.30am to 1.30pm, Monday to Friday for 38 weeks of the year. This includes a daily three-hour session, funded under the Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) scheme for eligible children. The service proposes to use an additional care room to accommodate children within their current capacity of 33.
Premises	The service is currently located in two rooms on the first floor of the Presentation Primary School in the town of Thurles in north Tipperary.
Staffing	The registered providers work directly with the children in the service each day. One of the two registered providers was present in the service on the day of inspection. There are six staff employed to work in the service including staff employed under the Access and Inclusion Model (AIM). All staff held appropriate qualifications to work in a pre-school service.
Methodology	The inspection was an announced inspection to assess compliance with the Childcare Act 1991 (Early Years Services) Regulations 2016 and Childcare Act 1991 (Early Years Services) (Amendment) Regulations 2016. The Inspection focused on regulations under the following themes: Governance, Health, Welfare and Development of the child, Safety and Premises. The findings on inspection based on information obtained through examination of documentation, direct observation, and discussion with relevant staff are documented in the inspection report and taken into consideration when making a decision in relation to registering the change in circumstance. Part III - Management and Staff

Regulation 9 – Management and Recruitment

(1) A registered provider shall ensure that—

(a) the service has a designated person in charge and a named person who is able to deputise as required.

Requirement met:	The requirement has been met. The registered provider is the designated person in charge and works directly with the children attending the service. A second named staff member is available to deputise as required.
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Part III - Management and Staff

Regulation 11 -Staffing Levels

(1) Subject to this Regulation, a registered provider shall ensure that there is at all times an adequate number of adults working directly with the children attending the pre-school service.

Requirement met:	The requirement has been met. The registered provider is familiar with the Child Care Act 1991 (early years services) Regulations 2016, Schedule 6, adult: child ratios and will ensure that there are always adequate numbers of staff working directly with the children attending the service. The registered provider is familiar with the requirement to have two staff present when registered and operating as a part-time service.

Regulation 20 - Facilities for Rest and Play

(1) Subject to this Regulation, a registered provider shall ensure that—

- (a) having regard to the number of pre-school children attending the service, their respective ages and the amount of time they spend on the premises, there are adequate and suitable facilities for each child to play indoors and, where required by these Regulations, outdoors, during the day, and
- (b) there are adequate and suitable facilities for a pre-school child to rest during the day, and in the case of an overnight pre-school service, during the day and the night.

(2) A registered provider—

- (b) of a full day care service, a part-time day care service, a sessional preschool service or a childminding service that moves premises on or after 30 June 2016, shall ensure that a suitable, safe and secure outdoor space to which the preschool children attending the service have access on a daily basis is provided on the premises.

Requirement met:

The requirement has been met.

- (1)(a) The new playroom was large and provided sufficient space. A range of toys and equipment suitable for the number, age and stage of development of the children who will attend the service was available.
- (b) There was a rest area available to the children.
- (2) Children shared an outside play area with the primary school.

Part V - Care of Child in Pre-school Service

Regulation 22 – Food and Drink

A registered provider shall ensure that adequate and suitable, nutritious and varied food and drink is available for each pre-school child attending the pre-school service.

Requirement met:

The requirement has been met.

Parents will be asked to supply the snacks and food for the children. The registered provider has advised parents that two snacks are required for children attending on a part time basis. The registered provider will have additional snacks available on the premises if a child has forgotten their food.

Regulation 23 - Safeguarding health, safety and welfare of child

A registered provider shall ensure that all reasonable measures are taken to safeguard the health, safety and welfare of a pre-school child attending the service and that the environment of the service is safe.

Requirement met:

The requirement has been met.

Infection control:

There was warm running water throughout the service, that did not exceed 43°C. There were designated children's toilets available to pre-school children.

Administration of medication:

There was a policy on the safe administration of medications to children attending the service.

General safety:

The main door to the premises had to be opened by staff.

Part VI - Safety

Regulation 25 – First Aid

- (1) *A registered provider shall ensure that a person trained in first aid for children is, at all times, immediately available to the children attending the pre-school service.*
- (2) *A registered provider shall ensure that a suitably equipped first aid box for children—*
- (a) is safely stored in an easily accessible and conspicuous position on the premises, and*
 - (b) is available to the children attending the pre-school service at all times.*

Requirement met:

The requirement has been met.

(1) Documentary evidence was available to demonstrate that staff were currently trained in FAR first aid for children and will always be present on the premises.

(2)(a) A suitable and fully equipped first aid box was available.

(b) First aid box was stored in an easily accessible place.

Regulation 26 – Fire Safety Measures

- (1) A registered provider shall ensure that a record in writing is kept of—
- (a) any fire drill that takes place in the premises, and
 - (b) the number, type and maintenance record of fire fighting equipment and smoke alarms in the premises.
- (4) A notice of the procedures to be followed in the event of fire shall be displayed in a conspicuous position in the premises.

Requirement met:	<p>The requirement has been met.</p> <p>(1)(a) The registered provider was familiar with the requirement to carry out monthly fire drills.</p> <p>(b) Fire-fighting equipment and smoke alarms were present, and contracts are in place for the regular service and maintenance of same.</p> <p>(4) A notice of procedures to be followed in the event of a fire was displayed in the playrooms and the fire assembly point was clearly identified.</p>

A registered provider shall ensure that the pre-school service is adequately insured.

Requirement met:	<p>The requirement has been met.</p> <p>An insurance certificate to demonstrate that insurance was in place was available.</p>
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Part VII – Premises and Space Requirements

Regulation 30 – Minimum Space Requirements

- (1) Subject to paragraphs (2) to (6), a registered provider shall ensure that adequate clear floor space is available in the premises for the work, play and movement of children attending the pre-school service.
- (2) A registered provider of a full day care service or a part-time day care service shall ensure that the minimum amount of clear floor space specified in column (3) of Schedule 7 opposite a particular reference number specified in column (1) of that Schedule in respect of the age range of children specified in column (2) thereof at that reference number is available for each child in that age range attending the service.

Requirement met:

The requirement has been met.

The proposed room was measured during the inspection.

(1) There is adequate clear floor space available to accommodate the number of children who attend the service.

(2) The playroom was spacious and bright with ample clear floor space for the number of children who attend the service.
