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Authority to Inspect

The Tusla Early Years Inspectorate carries out inspections of Early Years Services under Section 58(D) of the Child Care Act 1991 (as inserted by Section 92 of the Child and Family Agency Act 2013).

Description of Service	The service is located on the first floor of St. Johns the Apostle national school in Knocknacarra in the suburbs of Galway city. The service operates a sessional and part time service for pre-school children aged between 2 years and 6 years of age. The service offers an early childhood care and education, sessional care programme from 8:45 am to 12:15 pm and a part time service from 8:30 to 1.15 pm, Monday to Friday.
Premises	There is one playroom located on the first floor of the building and sanitary facilities. The service has an outdoor area at the front entrance to the service and children have access to outdoor play in a secured outdoor play area.
Staffing	There are 3 adults working in the service which includes the register provider. The adults working directly with the children in the service have completed a major award in Early Childhood Care and Education to a level 8 in Early Childhood Education.
Methodology	<p>The inspection was an announced inspection to assess compliance with the Childcare Act 1991 (Early Years Services) Regulations 2016 and Childcare Act 1991 (Early Years Services) (Amendment) Regulations 2016. The Inspection focused on regulations under the following themes: Governance, Health, Welfare and Development of the child, Safety and Premises.</p> <p>The findings on inspection based on information obtained through examination of documentation, direct observation, and discussion with relevant staff are documented in the inspection report and taken into consideration when making a decision in relation to registering the change in circumstance. The Inspectorate reserves the right to edit responses received for reasons including clarity; completeness; and compliance with administrative and legal processes. 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Part III - Management and Staff

Regulation 9 – Management and Recruitment

(1) A registered provider shall ensure that—

(a) the service has a designated person in charge and a named person who is able to deputise as required.

Requirement met:

(1)(a) The requirement has been met, as the registered provider has ensured that the service will have a named designated person in charge and a named deputy who can deputise as required.

Part III - Management and Staff

Regulation 11 -Staffing Levels

Requirement met:

(1) It is proposed that the minimum ratio of adults to children will be maintained which will be reflected in the staff roster. A documented staff roster was available.

Part V - Care of Child in Pre-school Service

Regulation 20 - Facilities for Rest and Play

(1) Subject to this Regulation, a registered provider shall ensure that—

(a) having regard to the number of pre-school children attending the service, their respective ages and the amount of time they spend on the premises, there are adequate and suitable facilities for each child to play indoors and, where required by these Regulations, outdoors, during the day, and

(b) there are adequate and suitable facilities for a pre-school child to rest during the day, and in the case of an overnight pre-school service, during the day and the night.

(2) A registered provider—

(b) of a full day care service, a part-time day care service, a sessional preschool service or a childminding service that moves premises on or after 30 June 2016, shall ensure that a suitable, safe and secure outdoor space to which the preschool children attending the service have access on a daily basis is provided on the premises.

(3) A registered provider of a full day care service, a part-time day care service or a childminding service, other than such a service to which paragraph (2) applies, shall ensure that—

(a) a suitable, safe and secure outdoor space to which the pre-school children attending the service have access on a daily basis is provided on the premises or

Requirement met:

(1) (a) Adequate and suitable facilities will be offered for play in the playroom and in the outdoor play area of the service

The playroom is laid out with defined interest areas. The registered provider intends to develop these interest areas further depending on the child's interests and emerging needs.

The registered provider advised that play equipment and materials that were specific to the preschool children attending the playrooms would be freely

	<p>available and accessible to these children. Additional equipment and materials will be rotated on a theme basis.</p> <p>The playroom environment supported each child’s learning, development, and wellbeing as -</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The indoor playroom was comfortable, clean, visually pleasing, and inviting and laid out to accommodate the needs of the children and adult staff member in the service. • The playroom had various interest areas. Equipment, toys, and materials were at children's level for them to be fully accessible to the children, visually and physically. <p>(b) Adequate facilities for rest were provided in the playroom, it has a soft seating area with a couch and matting to allow children to rest and relax when required. Children over 2 years of age had access to stackable beds and linen.</p> <p>(2)(b) The registered provider had documentary evidence of risk assessment and ensured that the proposed designated outdoor play areas. The outdoor play areas are maintained, suitable, safe, and secure.</p> <p>The surface area has a grass and impact absorbing surface and is surrounded by fencing.</p> <p>There is an adequate amount of defined interest areas with a sheltered area in the outdoor play area.</p> <p>(3)(a) The registered provider advised that all preschool children attending the service will play outside daily. There is a designated outdoor storage area for toys and equipment.</p>
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Part V - Care of Child in Pre-school Service

Regulation 22 – Food and Drink

A registered provider shall ensure that adequate and suitable, nutritious and varied food and drink is available for each pre-school child attending the pre-school service.

Requirement met:

- The service has a healthy eating policy in place.
- The service had a sample 3-week menu plan which is suitable balance and varied.
- A fridge is available for children attending on a sessional and part-time day-care basis.
- Water is available in the playroom and during outdoor play.
- The meal of the day is supplied by the parents.

Part VI – Safety

Regulation 23 - Safeguarding health, safety and welfare of child

A registered provider shall ensure that all reasonable measures are taken to safeguard the health, safety and welfare of a pre-school child attending the service and that the environment of the service is safe.

Requirement met:

GENERAL SAFETY:

- The main entrance door into the pre-school were secured to prevent unauthorised entry by a person or the unsupervised exiting by a pre-school child.
- Toys and play equipment were safe and in good condition in the playrooms.
- There was a wall mounted thermostat to ensure that the temperature in the playroom were maintained between 18°C to 22°C.
- Fire doors were unobstructed to ensure the safe evacuation in the event of a fire or other emergency.
- There was a designated storage area which was secured to prevent preschool children having access to chemicals or cleaning agents.
- All flexes and cables were out of reach of children or secured.
- The cords of the blinds were secured and fastened and therefore posed no risk to preschool children.
- There was a fridge for the storage of perishable items from children’s lunch boxes for their snack times.
- The registered provider had a risk assessment system. A system of checking toys and equipment was in place i.e., that they were not broken, clean and maintained in a good state of repair.
- There were no pits or ponds to cause any risk of danger to preschool children.
- The service had a daily record of attendance book to be kept for all the children attending the playrooms.

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INFECTION CONTROL:

- There was a cleaning schedule available and a sample cleaning record for the playroom, sanitary area, and outdoor play area.
- Hand washing facilities were provided with a supply of warm water, liquid hand soap and disposable paper hand towels.
- Thermostatically controlled warm water was available for use by the children to facilitate hygienic hand washing with a temperature reading of less than 43°C.

SAFE SLEEP:

- There was child size soft seating where children could rest or relax if they so choose.
- Stackable beds 5 in total were available for children over the age of 2 years of age.
- A sample physical sleep check form was available and in line with safe sleep best practice.
- The temperature in the designated sleep room was maintained between 18°C to 20°C.

Part VI - Safety

Regulation 25 – First Aid

- (1) A registered provider shall ensure that a person trained in first aid for children is, at all times, immediately available to the children attending the pre-school service.
- (2) A registered provider shall ensure that a suitably equipped first aid box for children—
- (a) is safely stored in an easily accessible and conspicuous position on the premises, and
 - (b) is available to the children attending the pre-school service at all times.

Requirement met:

- The requirement has been met
- (1) The person in charge and another staff member had evidence of current first aid responder for children qualification.
 - (2)
 - (a) A suitably equipped first aid box was readily available and was stored in an easily accessible position in the service.
 - (b) The first aid box is available for preschool children in the playroom.

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Part VI – Safety

Regulation 26 – Fire Safety Measures

- (1) A registered provider shall ensure that a record in writing is kept of—
- any fire drill that takes place in the premises, and
 - the number, type and maintenance record of fire fighting equipment and smoke alarms in the premises.
- (4) A notice of the procedures to be followed in the event of fire shall be displayed in a conspicuous position in the premises.

Requirement met:

The requirement has been met

- (1)(a) Arrangements were in place to record fire drills on a monthly basis.
- A record of the number, type, and maintenance record of firefighting equipment in the service was on file.
The firefighting equipment was professionally serviced on the 20/08/2024 and smoke fire detection system was professionally checked on the 20/08/2024.
- (4) A notice of the procedures to be followed in the event of a fire was displayed in the service.

Part VI – Safety

Regulation 28 – Insurance

A registered provider shall ensure that the pre-school service is adequately insured.

Requirement met:

The requirement has been met

An insurance certificate was available for 24 children in the part-time day-care service.

Part VII – Premises and Space Requirements

Regulation 29 – Premises

A registered provider shall ensure that the premises of the service are—

- of sound and stable structure,
- safe and secure,
- kept adequately lit, heated and ventilated,
- cleaned, maintained and repaired, as required, and
- equipped with adequate and suitable sanitary facilities.

Requirement met:

The requirement has been met

- From a visual inspection the service appeared to be of sound and stable structure.
- The indoor and outdoor play area were safe and secure.
 - The main door was secured into the service.
 - Restrictive access devices were fitted on the playroom windows.

	<p>(c)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• There is natural light throughout the building and openable windows.• There were artificial covered ceiling lights in the playroom, corridors, and sanitary areas.• The heating system had a thermostatically controlled to ensure the playroom temperature remains within the recommended temperature of between 18°C and 22°C.• The heating system was last serviced on the 22/08/2024.• Documentary evidence indicated that the heating system was last serviced annually. <p>(d)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• In the playroom, play and work equipment was new, clean and in good state of repair.• Cleaning products were safely stored in an inaccessible area away from the playrooms.• There was a cleaning schedule and cleaning checklist for the playroom, sanitary areas, and outdoor area.• The service was maintained in a clean and hygienic condition.• The service had a rodent proofing system in place. <p>(e)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Adequate and suitable sanitary facilities were provided.• There are 2 designated toilets with 2 wash hand basins in the sanitary areas. There were pedal bins in the sanitary area.• There was 1 nappy changing area with a wash hand basin and a self-sealing, leak proof pedal bin.• There was a designated adult toilet that were inaccessible to the preschool children. Foot pedal bins were provided in the sanitary areas.
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Part VII – Premises and Space Requirements

Regulation 30 – Minimum Space Requirements

- (1) *Subject to paragraphs (2) to (6), a registered provider shall ensure that adequate clear floor space is available in the premises for the work, play and movement of children attending the pre-school service.*
- (2) *A registered provider of a full day care service or a part-time day care service shall ensure that the minimum amount of clear floor space specified in column (3) of Schedule 7 opposite a particular reference number specified in column (1) of that Schedule in respect of the age range of children specified in column (2) thereof at that reference number is available for each child in that age range attending the service.*
- (3) *A registered provider of a sessional pre-school service or a pre-school service in a drop-in centre shall ensure that a minimum of 1.818 square metres of clear floor space is available for each child attending the service.*
- (4) *Where a registered provider contemporaneously provides—*
- (a) *a sessional pre-school service, and*
 - (b) *a full day care service or a part-time day care service, or both, the minimum clear floor space applicable for the duration of the sessional preschool service in respect of the children attending that service shall be the floor space specified in paragraph (3).*

Requirement met:

(1) – (4)

The requirement has been met as adequate floor space has been provided. The room measured 60m² which allows a maximum of 22 preschool children at any given time.
