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Authority to Inspect

The Tusla Early Years Inspectorate carries out inspections of Early Years Services under Section 58(D) of the Child Care Act 1991 (as inserted by Section 92 of the Child and Family Agency Act 2013).

Description of Service	The Diverseminds Academy propose to operate a service to provide full day care to children aged between 2 to 6 years. The proposed service will operate a full day care service from 8.00am to 6.00pm, with part time care and sessional care available, Monday to Friday, and accommodate a maximum of 44 children.
Premises	<p>The service proposes to operate from a two-storey premises in a residential area on the north side of Dublin city. There are two care rooms on the ground floor for use by the proposed service, namely.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Bright Moon room and the Shining Star room • An enclosed outdoor area is situated to the side of the building. <p>A service kitchen is provided for the preparation of meals for the children, sanitary facilities for staff and children and an administration office.</p>
Staffing	The service proposes to employ staff to include the proposed registered provider, the proposed person in charge and childcare staff as necessary to meet adult child ratios.
Methodology	<p>The inspection was an announced inspection to assess compliance with the Childcare Act 1991 (Early Years Services) Regulations 2016 and Childcare Act 1991 (Early Years Services) (Amendment) Regulations 2016. The Inspection focused on regulations under four themes; Governance, Health, Welfare and Development of the Child, Safety and Premises.</p> <p>The findings on inspection based on information obtained through examination of documentation, direct observation, and discussion with relevant staff are documented in the inspection report and taken into consideration when making a decision in relation to the registering application. The Inspectorate reserves the right to edit responses received for reasons including: clarity; completeness; and, compliance with administrative and legal processes. The contents of the report are compiled by the inspectorate body.</p>

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Part III - Management and Staff

Regulation 9 – Management and Recruitment

(1) A registered provider shall ensure that—

(a) the service has a designated person in charge and a named person who is able to deputise as required.

Requirement met:

The requirement has been met.

(1)(a) The service has a designated person in charge and a named staff member will be available to deputise as required.

Part III - Management and Staff

Regulation 11 -Staffing Levels

(1) Subject to this Regulation, a registered provider shall ensure that there is at all times an adequate number of adults working directly with the children attending the pre-school service.

(8) Without prejudice to paragraphs (2) to (7)—

(b) a childminder shall ensure that a second person familiar with the operation of the service and in a position to provide assistance to the childminder in operating the service is, at all times, within close distance of the service and available to attend the service to assist the childminder in the event of an emergency, and

(c) a registered provider of a sessional pre-school shall ensure that, where the person in charge operates the service single-handedly, a second person familiar with the operation of the service and in a position to provide assistance to the person in charge in operating the service is, at all times, within close distance of the service and available to attend the service to assist the person in charge in the event of an emergency.

Requirement met:

(1) The registered provider has proposed that the following number of adults will be working directly with the children attending the service.

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Part V - Care of Child in Pre-school Service

Regulation 20 - Facilities for Rest and Play

- (1) Subject to this Regulation, a registered provider shall ensure that—
- (a) having regard to the number of pre-school children attending the service, their respective ages and the amount of time they spend on the premises, there are adequate and suitable facilities for each child to play indoors and, where required by these Regulations, outdoors, during the day, and
 - (b) there are adequate and suitable facilities for a pre-school child to rest during the day, and in the case of an overnight pre-school service, during the day and the night.
- (2) A registered provider—
- (a) of a full day care service, a part-time day care service, a sessional preschool service or a childminding service that is registered for the first time on or after 30 June 2016, shall ensure that a suitable, safe and secure outdoor space to which the preschool children attending the service have access on a daily basis is provided on the premises.

Requirement met:

(1)(a) The requirement has been met.

The proposed two care rooms are bright with clear floor space available to enable children to explore their environment. All care rooms are fully equipped with a range of play materials and equipment suitable and accessible to the age and stage of development of the children attending each room. Low level furniture and shelving are available containing materials for free play, constructive play, creative play and imaginative play. These included designated interest areas including a home corner, sensory play areas and small world play areas accessible to the children at their level.

(1)(b) The Bright moon room can create a restful sleep environment for the children during sleep and rest time.

Children over the age of two years will be facilitated for sleep with 12 low beds which are available and stored in the office area. Rest areas are provided in each of the two care rooms to enable a child to take a break from activities if needed. The rest areas consisted of mats and cushions.

The service does not provide an overnight pre-school service.

(2)(a) The outdoor area provided on the premises, is secure and enclosed with walls and a locked gate. The area, which is easily accessible from the Shining Stars care room and through the gate at the end of the area, has an artificial grass surface. Suitable play equipment is available for example – slide, Water and sand play with supporting equipment, chalk, trucks, balls and a planting area. There are no ponds, pits or other hazards observed in the outdoor area.

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Part V – Care of Children in Pre-School Services

Regulation 22 – Food and Drink

A registered provider shall ensure that adequate and suitable nutritious and varied food and drink is available for each pre-school child attending the pre-school service.

Requirement met:

The requirement has been met.

A healthy eating policy is in operation within the service with all meals and snacks provided to the children attending full and part time care. Children attending on a sessional basis will bring their lunch from home. Breakfast, a morning snack, a hot meal at lunch time, an evening tea and an evening snack is available during the day with additional food and snacks available should a child become hungry between meals. The hot meal at lunch time will be supplied by an external catering company. Drinking water is available in all the care rooms if a child becomes thirsty.

Part VI – Safety

Regulation 23 - Safeguarding health, safety and welfare of child

A registered provider shall ensure that all reasonable measures are taken to safeguard the health, safety and welfare of a pre-school child attending the service and that the environment of the service is safe.

Requirement met:

The requirement has been met.

- The main entrance door which leads into the service is appropriately secured with an entry buzzer to prevent a child from exiting unsupervised and to prevent unauthorised access to the service.
- The play materials and equipment in the service are stored on stable-based shelving units. The play materials and equipment were observed to be safe and suitable for the developmental age of the proposed children.
- The tables and chairs in the care room that are used for tabletop activities and mealtimes are the appropriate height for the age of children accommodated in the room.
- A refrigerator is available in the kitchen and outside the Shining star room to store children's perishable food items from home on arrival to the service.
- The emergency exit doors of the service are unobstructed.
- The outdoor area is suitably secured by high walls and a secure gate, therefore preventing a child from exiting the area and preventing unauthorised access to the service.
- All storage of waste both indoors and outdoors is inaccessible to the children.
- A system is available for the safe storage of cleaning agents and equipment

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Part VI - Safety

Regulation 25 – First Aid	
<p>(1) A registered provider shall ensure that a person trained in first aid for children is, at all times, immediately available to the children attending the pre-school service.</p> <p>(2) A registered provider shall ensure that a suitably equipped first aid box for children—</p> <p>(a) is safely stored in an easily accessible and conspicuous position on the premises, and</p> <p>(b) is available to the children attending the pre-school service at all times</p>	
Requirement met:	<p>The requirement has been met.</p> <p>(1) The proposed registered provider has a First Aid Responder certificate available.</p> <p>(2)(a) A first aid box suitably equipped and safely stored is readily accessible and in a conspicuous position in the service.</p>

Part VI - Safety

Regulation 26 – Fire Safety Measures	
<p>(1) A registered provider shall ensure that a record in writing is kept of—</p> <p>(a) any fire drill that takes place in the premises, and</p> <p>(b) the number, type and maintenance record of fire fighting equipment and smoke alarms in the premises.</p> <p>(4) A notice of the procedures to be followed in the event of fire shall be displayed in a conspicuous position in the premises.</p>	
Requirement met:	<p>The requirement has been partially met.</p> <p>(1)</p> <p>(a) A template is available to record fire drills that take place in the service.</p> <p>(b) A record was available of the number, type and maintenance of the firefighting equipment of the service. Firefighting equipment was serviced on the 29 July 2024.</p> <p>(4) A notice of the procedures to be followed in the event of a fire is displayed in the entrance hall and each of the two-care room of the premises. Clearly displayed fire assembly notices are available outside of the service to enable staff and children to identify both the route to the fire assembly point.</p>
Requirement not met	<p>(1)(b) A record was not available of the number, type and maintenance of the smoke detection system of the service.</p>
Response from Provider	<p>(1)(b) The smoke alarms were serviced on the 3rd of September 2024. Certificate of Maintenance submitted as evidence.</p>
Summary Comment	<p>The requirement has been met.</p>

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Part VI - Safety

Regulation 28 – Insurance

A registered provider shall ensure that the pre-school service is adequately insured.

Requirement met: The registration team received a copy of adequate insurance from 09/09/2024 to 27/03/2025.

Summary Comment: The requirement has been met.

Part VII – Premises and Space Requirements

Regulation 29 – Premises

A registered provider shall ensure that the premises of the service are—

- (a) of sound and stable structure,*
- (b) safe and secure,*
- (c) kept adequately lit, heated and ventilated,*
- (d) cleaned, maintained and repaired, as required, and*
- (e) equipped with adequate and suitable sanitary facilities*

Requirement met: The requirement has been met.

(a) During the inspection it was observed that the walls, flooring, doors, and windows were suitably maintained.

(b) The entrance door to the service is adequately secured with an electric buzzer system to prevent children from exiting unsupervised and to prevent unauthorised access to the service.

(c) The Bright Moon room has artificial lights and the shining stars room has windows which provide natural lighting. The natural light can be augmented with artificial ceiling lighting as required. Ceiling lights are fitted with shatter proof coverings. Heating and ventilation are provided by an air-conditioning system throughout the service. The temperature of the care rooms was recorded between 20.2°C and 20.7°C on the day of inspection.

The sanitary facilities have windows and the nappy changing area in the disability toilet is fitted with a mechanical ventilation system to extract stale air.

(d) The care rooms are in a clean condition. A cleaning schedule is available in the care rooms and sanitary facilities to ensure regular cleaning of the service.

(e) Warm water not exceeding 43°C, liquid soap and paper hand towels are provided in the sanitary facilities. Separate lidded pedal operated bins are provided for the disposal of paper hand towels and nappies.

There are three toilets and three wash hand basins present in the sanitary facilities of the service. One nappy changing unit for use by the children is present in the disabled toilet area with one wash hand basin.

Mobile hand washing units are available in the two care rooms with soap and paper towels.

Staff members have the use of a separate sanitary facility on the second floor of the service building.

There are sufficient sanitary facilities available in the service to accommodate the number and age profile of the children which the Registered Provider proposes to attend.

The sanitary facilities in the service comprise of the following.

Part VII – Premises and Space Requirements

Regulation 30 – Minimum Space Requirements

- (1) *Subject to paragraphs (2) to (6), a registered provider shall ensure that adequate clear floor space is available in the premises for the work, play and movement of children attending the pre-school service.*
- (2) *A registered provider of a full day care service or a part-time day care service shall ensure that the minimum amount of clear floor space specified in column (3) of Schedule 7 opposite a particular reference number specified in column (1) of that Schedule in respect of the age range of children specified in column (2) thereof at that reference number is available for each child in that age range attending the service.*
- (3) *A registered provider of a sessional pre-school service or a pre-school service in a drop-in centre shall ensure that a minimum of 1.818 square metres of clear floor space is available for each child attending the service.*
- (4) *Where a registered provider contemporaneously provides—*
 - (a) *a sessional pre-school service, and*
 - (b) *a full day care service or a part-time day care service, or both,**the minimum clear floor space applicable for the duration of the sessional preschool service in respect of the children attending that service shall be the floor space specified in paragraph (3).*

Requirement met:

The requirement has been met

(1) The proposed registered provider ensured that adequate clear floor space is available in the premises for the work, play and movement of children attending the service.

(2) The proposed Bright Moon care room has clear floor space of 40.28 square metres available and the proposed Shining Stars care room has clear floor space of 96.22 square metres available. This is sufficient for the proposed maximum of 44 children to attend the service for full time care with the available sanitary facilities.

(3) The registered provider ensured that a minimum space of 1.818 square metres of clear floor space is available for each child attending the service on a sessional basis.

(4)(a) The minimum clear floor space is available for the duration of the sessional service.

(b) The minimum clear floor space is available for a full day care service or a part-time day care service.
