The Tusla Early Years Inspectorate carries out inspections of Early Years Services under Section 58(D) of the Child Care Act 1991 (as inserted by Section 92 of the Child and Family Agency Act 2013).

Description of Service	The proposed private childcare facility aims to provide full day care for children aged one year to six years of age. The service proposes to accommodate a maximum number of 45 children at full capacity. A school aged service will also be catered for.
Premises	The proposed service consists of a two storey, purpose-built premises which can accommodate the childcare service. There are two care rooms available on the ground floor one with a dedicated sleep room and a third care room on the first floor; a staff room, office, washroom and a kitchen are also provided. There is small enclosed outdoor space to the side of premises.
Staffing	The proposed registered provider will be initially working in the service but has appointed a manager and deputy manager for the facility. There will be five adults working with children and additional staff will be recruited as the number of children attending the service increases. The recruited staff have all attained at least a major award in Early Childhood Care and Education at Level 5 on the National Framework of Qualifications.
Methodology	<p>The inspection was an announced inspection to assess compliance with the Childcare Act 1991 (Early Years Services) Regulations 2016 and Childcare Act 1991 (Early Years Services) (Amendment) Regulations 2016. The Inspection focused on regulations under four themes; Governance, Health, Welfare and Development of the Child, Safety and Premises.</p> <p>The findings on inspection based on information obtained through examination of documentation, direct observation, and discussion with relevant staff are documented in the inspection report and taken into consideration when making a decision in relation to the registering application. Part III - Management and Staff

Regulation 9 – Management and Recruitment

(1) A registered provider shall ensure that—

(a) the service has a designated person in charge and a named person who is able to deputise as required.

Requirement met:	The requirement has been met. (1)(a) Then proposed registered provider has ensured that there will be a designated person in charge and a named person to deputise if required.
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Part III - Management and Staff

Regulation 11 -Staffing Levels

(1) Subject to this Regulation, a registered provider shall ensure that there is at all times an adequate number of adults working directly with the children attending the pre-school service.

Requirement met:	The requirement has been met. (1) The service proposes to accommodate 45 children on a sessional, part time and full-time basis with an adequate number of adults working directly with the children at all times. There will be five staff members employed in the service.
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Part V - Care of Child in Pre-school Service

Regulation 20 - Facilities for Rest and Play

(1) Subject to this Regulation, a registered provider shall ensure that—

- (a) having regard to the number of pre-school children attending the service, their respective ages and the amount of time they spend on the premises, there are adequate and suitable facilities for each child to play indoors and, where required by these Regulations, outdoors, during the day, and
- (b) there are adequate and suitable facilities for a pre-school child to rest during the day, and in the case of an overnight pre-school service, during the day and the night.

(2) A registered provider—

- (a) of a full day care service, a part-time day care service, a sessional preschool service or a childminding service that is registered for the first time on or after 30 June 2016, shall ensure that a suitable, safe and secure outdoor space to which the preschool children attending the service have access on a daily basis is provided on the premises.

Requirement met:

This requirement has been met.

(1)(a)

The proposed service comprises of three care rooms. The rooms are bright and spacious and well laid out to cater for the age range of children who will be attending in each room.

(b)

There is a cot room with six standard cots at present in the Wobbler room. Storable mattresses have been provided for children over two years of age and suitable rest areas are provided in each care room. Additional cots and mattresses will be purchased if required.

(2)(a)

The outdoor area is a small space consisting of 30.8 square meters. The area is covered by artificial grass. There were no ponds, pits or other hazards observed in the outdoor area. There was an assortment of suitable toys available for all proposed age groups attending the pre-school.

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Part V – Care of Children in Pre-School Services

Regulation 22 – Food and Drink

A registered provider shall ensure that adequate and suitable nutritious and varied food and drink is available for each pre-school child attending the pre-school service.

Requirement met:

The requirement has been met.

Parents will be requested to provide all snacks for their child attending on a sessional, parttime and fulltime basis. Two hot meals will be provided by the proposed registered provider and will be in line with the Health Eating policy of the service. Refrigerated storage facilities are available for perishable snacks.

An outside catering company will be providing the meals to the service. The staff will heat lunches required for children availing of parttime and full day care services. Portable water will be available for children.

If a child requires additional food the onsite kitchen will provide a healthy snack as needed.

Part VI – Safety

Regulation 23 - Safeguarding health, safety and welfare of child

A registered provider shall ensure that all reasonable measures are taken to safeguard the health, safety and welfare of a pre-school child attending the service and that the environment of the service is safe.

Requirement met:

The requirement has been met.

- The proposed registered provider stated the front door will be locked at all times, ensuring children cannot leave the service unsupervised and unauthorised access to the service cannot occur.
- The emergency exit doors were unobstructed.
- Storage is available for children’s belongings.
- Cleaning materials and equipment are locked in a cupboard in the service.
- The kitchen is inaccessible to children.
- A fridge is available in the kitchen for the storage of food.
- A cleaning schedule for toys and equipment was available.

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The sanitary accommodations were well stocked with a sufficient supply of liquid soap and paper hand towel. Each sanitary area has wall mounted warm air hand dryers. The water temperature was recorded at 34.7°C. Foot pedal bins were available in all sanitary areas, for the safe disposal of used paper towels. • The pre-school rooms and sanitary accommodations are ventilated by openable windows and wall vents. • Turnkey mechanisms are available on all external doors and emergency exits.
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Part VI - Safety

Regulation 25 – First Aid	
<p>(1) A registered provider shall ensure that a person trained in first aid for children is, at all times, immediately available to the children attending the pre-school service.</p> <p>(2) A registered provider shall ensure that a suitably equipped first aid box for children—</p> <p>(a) is safely stored in an easily accessible and conspicuous position on the premises, and</p> <p>(b) is available to the children attending the pre-school service at all times</p>	
Requirement met:	<p>The requirement has been met.</p> <p>(1) All staff employed in the service have a current certification in FAR training.</p> <p>(2)(a) A suitably equipped first aid box was available in each care room.</p> <p>(b) The first aid box was clearly identifiable and readily accessible in each room.</p>

Part VI - Safety

Regulation 26 – Fire Safety Measures

- (1) A registered provider shall ensure that a record in writing is kept of—
- (a) any fire drill that takes place in the premises, and
 - (b) the number, type and maintenance record of firefighting equipment and smoke alarms in the premises.
- (4) A notice of the procedures to be followed in the event of fire shall be displayed in a conspicuous position in the premises.

Requirement met:

The requirement has been met.

(1)(a)

The proposed registered provider has indicated that fire drills will continue to be carried out in all pre-school rooms when the Full Day care service is fully operational.

(b)

The maintenance record of the firefighting equipment and the smoke detection system was available and dated November 2023.

(4)

There were notices available in conspicuous positions in all care rooms of the procedure to be followed in the event of a fire.

Part VI - Safety

Regulation 28 – Insurance

A registered provider shall ensure that the pre-school service is adequately insured.

Requirement met:

Full insurance was provided to the registration office valid until 27/03/24 covering the care of the children on a full day care basis.

Part VII – Premises and Space Requirements

Regulation 29 – Premises

A registered provider shall ensure that the premises of the service are—

- (a) of sound and stable structure,*
- (b) safe and secure,*
- (c) kept adequately lit, heated and ventilated,*
- (d) cleaned, maintained and repaired, as required, and*
- (e) equipped with adequate and suitable sanitary facilities*

Requirement met:

The requirement has been met.

(a)

The proposed service is located on the ground floor and second floor of a purpose-built facility.

(b)

The point of entry to the service is through the main door which is monitored by the manager and is locked with an electronic keypad mechanism.

The small outdoor area is secured with a high metal fence and two high concrete walls. A securely locked gate allows for a one-way system from the outdoor area to the street. There are two access doors from the main building to the outdoor area, the first from the ground floor corridor and the second at the stair well of the service. These access doors are monitored to prevent a child leaving unsupervised and to prevent unauthorised access to the area.

(c)

The proposed premises benefits from natural light via windows in the pre-school rooms. There is supplemental artificial lighting also provided from covered fluorescent ceiling lights in the pre-school rooms. There is an air to water heating system in place which has been installed in November 2023. Windows in the pre-school rooms can be opened but have restrictors in place and there is natural ventilation in the sanitary areas.

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	<p>(d)</p> <p>A cleaning schedule was in place in all pre-school rooms. The premises and surrounding environment were clean and well maintained.</p> <p>(e)</p> <p>There is sanitary accommodation located adjacent to the Toddler room with two child size toilets and two sinks. The Wobbler room has a large, separate changing room with a large changing table that contains two changing mats and three low level sinks. Upstairs in the Pre-school room there is sanitary accommodation located in the room with two child size toilets and two sinks. A separate toilet and wash hand basin is located on the ground floor for adults and another toilet for disability access. Thermostatically controlled hot water was available in the children’s sanitary areas and the temperature of the water in the low sinks was 34.7°C.</p>
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Part VII – Premises and Space Requirements

Regulation 30 – Minimum Space Requirements

- (1) *Subject to paragraphs (2) to (6), a registered provider shall ensure that adequate clear floor space is available in the premises for the work, play and movement of children attending the pre-school service.*
- (2) *A registered provider of a full day care service or a part-time day care service shall ensure that the minimum amount of clear floor space specified in column (3) of Schedule 7 opposite a particular reference number specified in column (1) of that Schedule in respect of the age range of children specified in column (2) thereof at that reference number is available for each child in that age range attending the service.*

Requirement met:	<p>The requirement has been met.</p> <p>(1) Adequate clear floor space has been provided for the work, play and movement of the number of children proposing to attend the service as demonstrated below:</p> <p>(2)</p> <p>Ground Floor</p> <p>Room 1. (Toddler room)</p> <p>The clear floor space in the proposed Toddler room measured 15.11 square metres.</p>
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Room 2. (Wobbler room)

The clear floor space in the proposed Wobbler room measured 39.9 square metres.

Upstairs

Room 2. (Pre-school room)

The clear floor space in the proposed Pre-school room measured 36.70 square metres.

There is sufficient space in the service to cater for 41 pre-school children on a part-time/full time basis in the proposed age ranges.
